Mexican Art Exhibit at SMF

“The Dream of Earth: 21st Century Tendencies in Mexican Sculpture”, currently on display in Terminal B at Sacramento International Airport, presents the work of six renowned representatives of Mexican contemporary clay sculpture. The Sacramento County Airport System, the General Consulate of Mexico, Sacramento, CA, the Mexican Cultural Center of Northern California, and the Sacramento Metropolitan Arts Commission worked together to bring this international touring exhibition to Sacramento.

An international touring exhibition, “The Dream of Earth” represents the work of Mexican-born artists Gerardo Azcunaga, Adriana Margain, Javier Marin, Miriam Medrez, Maribel Portela and Paloma Torres. Airport visitors can view twelve pieces from the exhibit in Terminal B. In addition, several larger freestanding works are on display at the CAL/EPA Headquarters Building at 10th and I Streets. “Dream of Earth” is on exhibit at Sacramento International Airport through July 20. The tour’s next destination is San Francisco.

Starbucks Coffee Now Open in Terminal B

Starbucks is now open on the lower level of Terminal B. Located in the central restaurant area, the coffee retailer is open to both ticketed and non-ticketed customers. The new Starbucks offers a traditional menu of coffee, espresso, tea, other beverages and pastries, plus grab-and-go sandwiches and salads.

In addition, construction continues on Chili’s Too and Prospector’s Pub. They are replacing the former cafeteria and bar located on the lower level of Terminal B. The popular eatery and remodeled bar are expected to open by late summer.

During construction, Terminal B visitors can purchase grab-and-go items at Starbucks or a temporary kiosk located near the restaurant area. Ticketed passengers are encouraged to try Pyramid Alehouse on the B-1 upper concourse and Gordon Biersch Brewery on the B-2 upper concourse.
