Sacramento County Airport System recently unveiled a scale-model of the new Central Terminal B. The model will soon be on display at Sacramento International Airport. Construction on the new terminal is scheduled to begin in 2008.

SMF Launches "Flight View"

Picture this scenario. Your best friend calls you from Seattle and asks you to pick her up at Sacramento International Airport tonight at around 5 p.m. You missed the call, and all you have is her voice message. Two airlines fly nonstop between Sacramento and Seattle, Southwest in Terminal A and Alaska in Terminal B. How do you know where to park?

The answer is simple. Visit the Sacramento County Airport System Web site and click on [Flight Info](#). The Airport System recently launched a new real-time flight information page. By clicking on the SMF Flight View link, visitors can find information on all flights arriving and departing from Sacramento International Airport within a 5.5 hour period. Viewers can sort by time, flight number, departing city, and airline. Delays are posted as soon as the airlines transmit the information to the system.

SMF Flight View is a great tool for checking flight status, but departing passengers are encouraged to contact their airlines for accurate check-in information. Remember 3-1-1 When Packing

The Transportation Security Administration (TSA) advises passengers to prepare for the checkpoint using the new “3-1-1 for Your Carry-On” guidelines. Containers that hold a maximum of three ounces may be filled with liquid or gel if packed into one quart-sized, clear, zip-top bag. One bag of this type is allowed per passenger. Liquids and gels that exceed the “3-1-1” limits should be packed in checked luggage.

Holiday Travel Tips

Traveling over the holidays can be stressful. Help yourself relax by following these simple tips.

- During peak days this holiday season, traffic arriving at Terminal A will be directed into separate lanes for departures and arrivals. This process keeps traffic flowing smoothly and quickly directs vehicles to the appropriate curbs. Drivers picking up or dropping off passengers should look for the cones and uniformed personnel directing traffic.
- Fly with unwrapped gifts in both your carry-on and checked luggage. If a wrapped gift sets off an alarm, TSA screeners will unwrap the gift.
- Check all the pockets of your luggage for prohibited items before heading to the airport.
- Review the luggage restrictions for both your airline and the TSA before packing your suitcases.
- Allow extra time to park, travel to your gate, and get through the security checkpoint.
