1,000,000+ Passengers in June

Passenger numbers at Sacramento International Airport recently exceeded one million in a month for the first time in the airport's history. In June 2007, total airport passengers reached 1,015,616. The one million passenger milestone is supported by 4.8% growth from June 2006 (969,411 passengers). Calendar year-to-date statistics show 5% passenger growth.

"Sacramento International has experienced continual growth since 2002 but this milestone is an achievement to celebrate," said Hardy Acree, Sacramento County Airport System Director of Airports, "By providing a convenient, accessible alternative to the Bay Area airports and meeting customer needs with free WiFi, additional flights, restaurants and retail shops we demonstrate to the customer that we are serious about providing customer service second to none and appreciate their business."

Over the past six months, Sacramento International has celebrated the inauguration of non-stop service to seven new cities by ExpressJet Airways; Albuquerque, Colorado Springs, Oklahoma City, San Antonio, Spokane, Tucson, and Tulsa. In addition, Air Canada joined the airport with service Vancouver, BC and Frontier Airlines added flights to Los Cabos, Mexico.

During the same period, retail and restaurant offerings in

Terminal A have expanded to include Vino Volo (a wine tasting venue), and Massage Bar.

As a convenience to customers, dispensers offering hand sanitizer and lotion have been placed in the public restrooms and recycling bins have been placed throughout the terminals.

Sacramento County Airport System recently ranked high in J.D. Power and Associates' annual customer service survey. Sacramento International Airport scored second in the nation among similar-sized airports. The airport received 713 points out of 1000 – only eight points behind the top mid-sized airport.

ARCO Gas Station Closed for Construction

On July 30, the Arco AM/PM gas station at Sacramento International Airport closed to facilitate the second phase of construction at the site. A new, larger convenience store with a car wash was constructed during phase one. Phase two is focused on improving fueling convenience for busy travelers by increasing the total number of pumps from 6 to 10.

Gasoline is not available at Sacramento International Airport



until the new facility opens on approximately September 30. Until reopening, fuel is available at the following locations nearest to the airport:

North of the airport along Interstate 5, Road 102 Exit

- Arco AM/PM, Shell on the east side of the freeway (8 miles from airport)
- Chevron on the west side of the freeway (8 miles from airport)

South of the airport along Interstate 5, Del Paso Road Exit, on the east side of the freeway

- Chevron and Safeway (4.2 miles from airport)
- Shell (4.8 miles from airport)
- Arco AM/PM (6.5 miles from airport)

"We appreciate the public's patience during construction," said Hardy Acree, Director of Airports. "The new facility is poised to continue to serve the needs of our customers, add new amenities for the traveling public and ensure a superior level of customer service."

When complete, the new facility will boast a new, 2,700 square foot mini market. The facility will include amenities such as a drive-through car wash, restrooms and complete fast food and beverage areas.

Massage Bar Now Open

A new service at Sacramento International Airport is sure to make air travel much more relaxing. Located on the upper concourse in Terminal A, [Massage Bar](#) recently began easing the tension in passengers' necks and backs at the Capital City airport.

Massage Bar offers different lengths of massages, from the Single Shot at fifteen minutes, to the Quad Shot that lasts a full hour. Prices start at \$21 for fifteen minutes. Massage Bar is open to ticketed passengers from 6 a.m. to 9 p.m. on a first-come, first-served basis.

New Safety Measure

Sacramento International Airport recently installed a new pedestrian safety measure. Rumble strips have been placed in front of all pedestrian crosswalks at Terminal A and Terminal B. The strips alert motorists to upcoming crosswalks and increase awareness that pedestrians may be crossing. Each strip features several rows of raised white bumps which require drivers to slow their vehicles when they approach a crosswalk. The airport also installed new pedestrian crossing signs prior to both terminals.
