

Passengers Urged to Plan Ahead for I-5 Project

On Friday, May 30th, Caltrans and C.C. Meyers Construction will start a seven week project to repair a critical portion of Interstate 5 in downtown Sacramento.

The project will be constructed in four phases in which sections of I-5 through downtown will be closed, including some on and off ramps.

Drivers can expect long delays while traveling around Sacramento during the project. All four construction phases will affect traffic heading to and from Sacramento International Airport. When northbound lanes are closed during Phases 1 and 3, Caltrans officials recommend adding one hour on top of a normal airport commute, especially during rush hour. Travelers may be delayed up to one hour when departing from the airport during Phases 2 and 4, when southbound lanes will be closed.

The expected construction schedule and traffic delays may change due to weather, materials or other factors. Airport officials encourage travelers to visit www.fixl-5.com for the latest information about lane closures, alternate routes and construction schedules. On this Web site passengers can sign up for email alerts and learn more about the project. Travelers can also call 5-1-1

for real-time traffic updates.

Sacramento International Airport is partnering with Caltrans to publicize the I-5 project to airport passengers and employees. These publicity efforts include links on the airport Web site, signs in the Terminals, changeable signs on airport roads, and communication with airlines, rental car agencies and taxi drivers.

New Tool on Airport Noise Web Site

Sacramento County Airport System recently launched WebTrak 2.0, a program that lets the public see the general location of flights in the greater Sacramento region. WebTrak 2.0 uses the same data collected by Airport System staff members who monitor and respond to noise concerns. The updated program is easier to use than previous tools available on the [Noise Web site](#).

Anyone with an internet-ready computer and Adobe Flash version 9 or higher can use WebTrak 2.0 at www.sacairports.org/noise/WebtrakIntro.html. Simple controls allow users to view flights by date, time and location. The interactive map provides flight identification, aircraft type, and altitude in Mean Sea Level. Real time data viewed in the Live Mode is delayed by 21 minutes for security reasons. Historical data viewed in the Replay Mode is available for up to 90 days.
